## **Nursery**

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely break. For our final term, our topic is 'All Creatures Great and Small'.

We will be starting with the fabulous text The Very Hungry Caterpillar, learning the lifecycle of a butterfly and hatching our own butterflies to support this. We will also be reading other books such as, Going on a Lion Hunt, Walking Through the Jungle and Snail Trail.

We have made great progress in our phonics so far and will continue to blend simple 3 letter words as well as beginning to write some simple words such as pig, dog and cat, etc. Letter formation is a big priority and the children need to learn to really concentrate when they writing and improve their hand eye coordination.

In Maths this term, we will revisit pattern, size comparisons (including capacity) and really focussing on careful and accurate touch counting.

This final half term, we are hoping the weather will be kind and really allow us to utilise our fantastic outdoor area. We will be hunting for bugs, caring for and harvesting some of our vegetables and practising our catching, throwing and aiming skills.

In PSHE, we will be focussing on resolving conflicts and being more assertive and confident in new situations.



## Reception

Welcome back, we hope you enjoyed your break. It is hard to believe that it is the last half term of Reception where we will be working closely with the children to make sure they meet their Early Learning Goals. This half term is all about Science. Our Talk 4 Writing book, '10 Things I Can Do to Help My World' encourages the children to think about what they can do to help the planet. In the continuous provision, the children will be science detectives. They will be exploring the bones in our bodies, experimenting with magnets, floating and sinking, and looking at changes in materials. They will continue to look after our gardening area, as well as taking care of the living things that share our outdoor space.

The children will be developing their independent writing skills, writing simple sentences which will include writing their own list of how to look after our planet. They will need to be able to check their writing and read it back to make sure it makes sense. Please encourage your child to have a go at writing sentences at home. Bring them in to school, we would love to share them with the class. In Maths, the children will be learning about odd and even numbers, doubling, sharing and grouping and number bonds to 10. They will explore pattern and continue to work on their shape knowledge.

In PE, the children will be reinforcing their ball skills as well as thinking of different ways we can keep healthy and how to keep safe in the sun. We will also be launching our new woodwork cabin where children will be taught skills using real tools safely. Watch this space for our class woodwork project!

## Year 1

Year 1 have worked phenomenally hard so far this year and we are so proud of the progress each and every child has made. As you are aware, the children will be sitting their phonics screen test in the week commencing 10th June. It is vital the phonics SWAY is still accessed after this to ensure children are prepared for their transition to Year 2.

This half term, we will be covering: position and direction, money (recognising coins and notes), place value (within 100) and time (understanding the key words 'before' and 'after' and time to the 1 hour and the half of an hour). There are so many opportunities to support your child at home with these areas of Maths. In our Writing unit, we will be using the book, 'My Name is Not Refugee', by Kate Milner, alongside, 'We Are Going on a Bear Hunt', by

Michael Rosen to write a story about a journey. We are working incredibly hard in school to ensure children are forming their upper and lower case letters correctly and are confident when punctuating a sentence. This includes capital letters, finger spaces and a piece of punctuation.

In our History lessons, we will be exploring how homes have changed over time. Do you know when your home was built? Can you research it with your child? In our Science lessons, we will be learning all about humans. We will explore the different body parts and the five senses they are linked to. In our PSHE lessons, we will be recognising what makes us unique and special, exploring feelings and strategies of how to manage situations when things go wrong. In RE, we will be exploring beliefs and celebrating everyone's beliefs. As a Rights Respecting school, we understand the importance of all children knowing their right to their freedom of thoughts, celebrating their thoughts and religions. (Article 4). In Art, we will be observing and using materials from the natural world. In Music, we will be exploring the speed, tone and volume.

We are thoroughly looking forward to a very exciting, jam packed half term with Year 1!

Welcome back everyone! We can't believe that it is the final half term of Year 2. We are so excited to enjoy our last half term together and to prepare the children for Year 3.

We are looking forward to an exciting half term, especially as it is finally our turn to go to Forest School! Each class will have the opportunity to spend a full day visiting the forest where they will experience different activities related to Science.

In English, we will be reading 'Traction Man is Here' by Mini Grey and we will be creating our own comic books. We will then be writing letters based on the book 'Me

and My Fear' by Francesca Sanna. This is a fantastic book that teaches children about what it might be like to move to a new country. In Maths, we will be learning how to measure in different ways such as length and mass. We will also be learning about different types of turns. In History, we will be learning about different explorers such as Neil Armstrong and Sacagawea. In Art, we will be creating pictures using water colours and we will be learning about different artists such as Claude Monet and David Hockney. In PSHE, we will be learning about what happens to us as we grow older and in RE, we will be learning about caring for others. Finally, we will be playing tri-golf in PE and we will be learning how to make quizzes online in Computing.

## Year 3

Welcome back! We hope you enjoyed your half term break and are ready for the last term of Year 3!

We have a very busy final half term coming up, with our class assemblies ,sports day and lots of exciting things to learn about.

This half term we will be reading a fantastic book called 'The Journey' which is all about refugees. We will be using this book to support our work on setting descriptions in English. We will also be creating an non-chronological report about Manchester's famous landmarks. Perhaps you could visit some to help with inspiration for this.

In Maths, we will be continuing to learn more about telling the time, and looking at what information we can find from calendars to create facts about days and months. We will then be looking at shape and angles. Finally, we will be learning to read and create graphs in Statistics.

In History, we will be learning about Ancient Greece, their influence on life today and how they link to our other previous topic, the Egyptians. We are also going to be reading lots of different texts about Ancient Greek myths and linking this to our art projects. In Science, we will be building on what we learnt about forces and looking at magnetism, this will give us the chance to conduct some interesting experiments and see what we can find out! The summer weather should also give us the opportunity to get out onto the field and practice our skills in golf and tennis which we are very much looking forward to!

Welcome to the final half term of Year 4! The year seems to have flown by. We really enjoyed developing our skills across the curriculum last half term and it was great to express our creativity during our DT lessons, making torches. We have got lots of exciting things planned for this half term and we can't wait to get started!

We have already started reading 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' and we are loving it! It is going to help us write a diary entry in role as one of the characters and a persuasive speech linking to the Rights of Refugees.

In maths, we are exploring shape, identifying angles, shape and lines of symmetry. Keep

practising telling the time at home, using different clocks. We will then move onto statistics, interpreting charts and graphs and then finally position and direction, where we will explore coordinates and translation. We have our multiplication check this half term, so make sure you continue to practise at home. Each child should be aiming to get as close to 25/25 as possible, so it is very important that everyone knows all of their times tables to 12x12 and can recall them within 6 seconds.

In history, we will be exploring Emeline Pankhurst and the impact she has had on life as we know it today. As part of this topic, we will be taking a trip to the Pankhurst Centre in Manchester to find out more.

This half term is an exciting term for enrichment activities. We have our Careers Market Place which involves guest speakers, activities linked to careers and opportunities to dress up as career choices. Sports Day is also this half term, where we will compete within our houses in athletic events.

In Maths, we will continue learning about decimals and will be eventually moving on to negative numbers, converting units and volume.


In Science, we will be exploring earth and space. In History, we will be learning about the quest for knowledge. We will be reflecting upon early civilisations and the science revolution.

Welcome back to your child's final half-term in the Primary Phase! Time really does fly!

Year 6 are still working incredibly hard to produce high-quality pieces of writing. Our next unit will be based on a book called 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. The Arrival is a migrant story told as a series of wordless images. Firstly, Year 6 will be writing a letter based on this book. After that, Year 6 will be encouraged to choose their own piece of writing to base on this book. This will include them creating their own RAFT (Reason, Audience, Features and Tone) for their writing!

In Maths, we will be consolidating previous taught knowledge, in order to fully prepare students for their learning in Year 7. This will be supported by a Maths session at the

Secondary Phase. There will also be transition sessions, led by secondary teachers, in other subjects, including Science and D.T.

During History this half term, we will introduce the rise and fall of the British Empire, and its legacy in Britain from the 1960s to today. In PSHE lessons, we will explore the key concept of growing and changing.

As you are probably aware, Year 6 have begun auditioning and practising for their end-of-year production of 'The Jungle Book'. We will soon be sending out further information about the show, including your child's role in the production and costumes needed. Thank you in advance for all your support and help preparing for your child's epic performance.


